- Compulsory Māori section within NZPI membership accreditation process.
- Papa Pounamu page within NZPI website.
- Encourage links to Papa Pounamu page on websites of local authorities, runanga, government agencies, universities and wananga.
- Developing a position paper to guide NZPI submissions.
- Appointing representatives in all rohe across the motū.
- Make Papa Pounamu membership open to all peoples.
- Establishing and maintaining strategic relationships with relevant organisations including Ngā Aho, NZ Māori Legal Forum, Iwi Leaders Advisory Group, Auckland City Council Pacific Islands Forum, and the Auckland Council Independent Māori Statutory Board.

- Market planning profession within secondary schools and at careers expos.
- Target Pacific peoples and Maori university students studying planning and environmental resource management related degrees.

- Increase networks with relevant Māori tertiary (Wānanga) providers.
- Share information and case study examples.
- Develop a support network for Pacific peoples and Māori working in planning.
- Māori planners practicing at all levels of planning sector (career advancement).
- Recognise and assist planning work at hapū and marae levels to be more effective.
